What is your field of expertise?


Environmental Economics, Transportation Economics, Urban and Regional Economics.

Can you briefly describe one of your research articles?

My article's purpose was to analyze the determinants of public transportation demand in the European Union, focusing on recent CO₂ emission regulations for passenger vehicles. I estimated bus, train, metro, and high-speed train ridership demand in the European Union.

Which courses do you teach at PC?

I teach Principles of Economics: Micro, Microeconomic Analysis, Urban Economics, and Managerial Economics.
